New COVID-19 Fee Schedule Published

On April 24, 2024, the <u>Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS)</u> published a new <u>Illinois Medicaid COVID-19</u>
<u>Fee Schedule</u> effective retroactively to January 1, 2024.

Practitioner Proposed Rate Adjustments for April 1, 2024

On April 2, 2024, the <u>Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS)</u> issued a <u>Provider Notice</u> informing providers of planned rate adjustments effective for service dates beginning April 1, 2024. These rate adjustments impact both the fee-for-service (FFS) and the Medicaid managed care organizations (MCOs).

The proposed rate changes must be approved by the federal Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). HFS will

post new fee schedules as soon as the rate updates are approved by federal CMS.

The IPHA Third-Party Billing Team will provide updates as more information becomes available.

GET TO KNOW THE MCOS

HFS operates three distinct care coordination programs within Illinois' Medicaid Managed Care program:

HealthChoice Illinois (HCI), YouthCare, and the Medicare Medicaid Alignment Initiative (MMAI). To help provide Medicaid clients with quality services, enhance healthcare coordination, and manage costs, HFS has

partnered with six <u>Managed Care</u>
<u>Organizations</u> (MCOs), also known as
Medicaid Health Plans, to manage and
administer benefits for beneficiaries within
each of these care coordination programs.
The six Illinois Medicaid MCOs are:

- Aetna Better Health Illinois
- Blue Cross Blue Shield of Illinois
- CountyCare
- Humana
- Meridian
- Molina Healthcare

This month, we focus on Meridian Health Plan of Illinois. Meridian serves clients enrolled in HealthChoice Illinois (HCI), Medicare Medicaid Alignment Initiative (MMAI), and YouthCare.

Eligibility can be verified via the <u>MEDI</u> system. Meridian also has a <u>verification tool</u> to determine eligibility within the provider portal. Guidance on Medicaid Pre-Authorization of services can be found here.

To take advantage of **free interpretation services**, call Member and Provider Services at 866-606-3700 (TTY: 711), Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM and ask for an interpreter.

Directions on how to pursue claim denials can be found on their <u>Claims Disputes</u> page. For claim rejections, providers may email: EDIBA@CENTENE.COM. If all dispute efforts have been exhausted and a provider is still not satisfied with the outcome, providers can send claims to their assigned Provider Relations Representative for further review. If a provider does not have an assigned Provider Relations Representative, the provider can utilize the Provider Relations Intake Form for additional assistance. The Providers Claims Alerts page shares information about known claim processing issues and actions being taken to resolve them.
